- holding chicks, ducklings and rabbits







SEMESTER ONE REPORTS

The Semester One reports will be emailed and published directly to you through Connect on Wednesday 27th June 2018. Connect has been implemented in our school as one of our main forms of communication. Connect is an integrated online environment developed by the Department of Education WA for staff, students and parents in public schools.



How will parents access Connect?

You should have received your own secure login to Connect upon enrolment via email. Connect is totally free and, because it is provided by the Department of Education, very safe. As well as being able to login to Connect on any internet-enabled device, you may also receive notices from Connect that will be sent to you as either an email or a notification on your phone.

A free app called Connect Now can be downloaded from Google Play or the Apple App Store and will let you receive Connect notices as push notifications.

What is the benefit of an E Report?

- The ability to easily reprint and forward copies of reports.
- Parents being able to retain a digital record of student achievement.

A link will be emailed to parents, please ensure you save your child's report or access their report through Connect. As the link to access the school reports is only live for four weeks, please ensure you download the report then save it or print out a hardcopy—even better, do both!

If you have not provided the school with an up to date email address or have had issues with logging into Connect, please return the below slip by Wednesday 13th June 2018 to your child's classroom teacher.
