

Alkimos Beach Primary school will be running a **Mobile Muster** this term for members of the community to bring in any unwanted mobile phones to be recycled.

The purpose of a **Mobile Muster** transforms the components from mobile phones into valuable materials for reuse. Glass, aluminium, gold, silver, plastic, copper and the batteries can all be recycled to make new products from recycled mobile phones. If you, or any one you know, have any old mobiles that are just sitting in your cupboards or draws that you no longer need or want, please bring them in to the office and we will place them into our Mobile Muster recycling bin.

#### SCHOOL BATTERY RECYCLING PROGRAM

#### WHAT IS THE MEANING OF A POPPY ON REMEMBRANCE DAY?

The poppy is the enduring symbol of remembrance of the First World War. It is strongly linked with Armistice Day (11 November), but the poppy's origin as a popular symbol of remembrance lies in the landscapes of the First World War. Poppies were a common sight, especially on the Western Front. The remembrance poppy was inspired by the World War I poem "In Flanders Fields". Its opening lines refer to the many poppies that were the first flowers to grow in the churned-up earth of soldiers' graves in Flanders, a region of Belgium.

#### SAFE PARKING AROUND SCHOOLS



The safety of our students is an ongoing concern and we would like to reinforce a number of safety messages:

- We implore you to comply with all the parking restrictions and speed limits around the school. We regularly revise road and pedestrian safety with the children, but your attitudes and behaviours provide an even stronger message.
- Several students are riding bicycles and scooters to school. This is excellent provided they dismount before they enter the gates to the school grounds and wear a helmet.
- We have reports of cars driving too fast and parking incorrectly.
- Children need assistance in the traffic environment until at least the age of 10. They are not equipped physically or developmentally to make the crucial decisions to keep themselves safe.
- All children need to be actively supervised in and around moving vehicles including on footpaths, shared paths, driveways and car parks, at traffic lights, zebra and other road crossings and on quiet streets and busy roads.
- Your children are always watching and want to be just like adults. Make sure you always set a positive example around traffic and talk to your children about why you are stopping at the kerb and what you are watching and listening for. Explain where and when it is safe to cross and why.
- Hold hands with your children around traffic. If your hands are full, make sure your children hold onto your bag, pram, or even your arm or sleeve.
