2020 KINDY ENROLMENTS



STUDENT SAFETY

We have received concerns from parents who have witnessed parents in the Kindy and Pre Primary car park driving over the kerbing and mounting the path which is extremely dangerous. Please be patient when dropping off and collecting your child each day.

Please also note that the disabled bays in front of admin should not be used by parents to drop children or drop personal items off. Please leave these bays free for their specific purpose and utilise the other free car park spaces.

SOME HELPFUL INFORMATION IN OUR COLD AND FLU SEASON

Colds, upper respiratory tract infections are everywhere, especially in winter, so it is almost impossible to stop children from catching them.

Here are some points which may help:

- Teach your child to cover his/her nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing, and to wash hands straight afterwards.
- Hands should be washed after blowing noses and before eating.
- Use tissues once and then throw them in the bin. (Avoid using handkerchiefs.)
- Keep your child home from school if he/she has a cold/cough/fever/pain.
- Make sure that your children eat a balanced diet of plenty of healthy foods.
- Keep children away from smoke it irritates their eyes and nasal passages, making it more likely that they will catch a cold. What to do if your child gets a cold No treatment will cure a cold or make it go away more quickly but you can help your child feel more comfortable:
- Rest: This need not be in bed.

• Provide extra drinks: If your child doesn't want to drink much, try giving lots of small sips of water, milk or juice, or ice blocks to suck for older children.

If your child seems unwell please keep them home until they are feeling better. Please contact the school to let us know that they will be absent and where possible provide a medical certificate if it is for more than a couple of days.
