### Pre-Primary 2020 Enrolment information

We are about to commence the enrolment process of current Kindergarten students for Pre-Primary 2020. We will be processing these applications in stages so please read carefully to see the specific dates allocated for your child's enrolment. The office will accept applications from 8.30am - 3.00pm - Monday to Friday. All forms need to be completed in the office so please allow yourself at least 15 minutes to complete the process.

At the time of application you will be required to provide the following documentation. Please ensure that you have immediate access to these when you visit the office.

- Current proof of address (gas/electric usage bill)
- MyGov Immunisation History Statement -  
(<https://www.humanservices.gov.au/individuals/services/medicare/australian-immunisation-register/how-get-immunisation-history-statement>)
- Visa documentation (Where applicable)

You will be required to complete an application form, student update form and re-sign the original Kindergarten enrolment form once the application has been approved. Please note that if you have moved out of the local intake area you are not guaranteed a Pre Primary place in 2020.

Once your application is approved we will write to you to confirm acceptance.

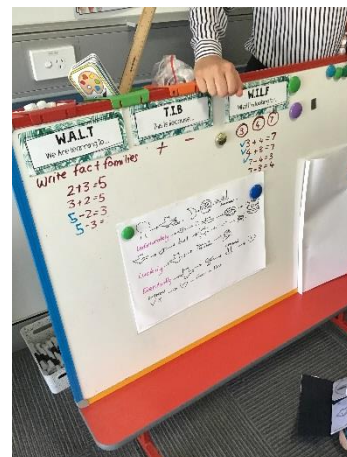
The Pre-Primary/Year Ones have taken a liking to Maths and Science. They have also been learning about their family tree, and in Geography they have been learning about the natural environment.

We also managed to squeeze in a visit to the Year 1s of Ningaloo Reef 2 and Mrs Chalmers!

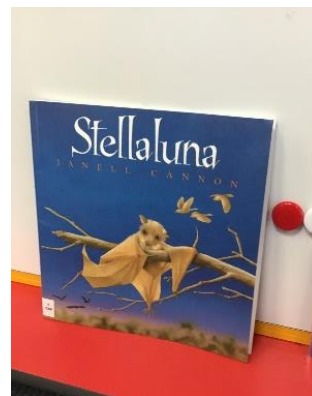
