A message from our Principal

Dear Parents & Carers,

The year has just flown by and we are now down to only 4 weeks before the end of term. I would like to thank all of our parents for the support that they have given us in regards to ensuring that our students wear helmets when riding scooters and bicycles as this is a law since 1993. It is really important from a safety perspective as head injuries are more common than we think when accidents happen.

We are exploring whether we qualify for a traffic warden and I would like to thank those parents that have volunteered to assist me with this process. We will be completing this over the next few weeks and I will provide our community with information when this is completed.

We have had the Alkimos Pirates Lacrosse Club here this week instructing many of our students in the rules and playing of this game. The students have thoroughly enjoyed and Mr Innes is working on having some follow up sessions for our students in this sport.

Just to note, we have had some community feedback about some of our students acting inappropriately at the fitness park. Please remind your children that they are representing the school if they are at the park in their school uniform.

MISSING NECKLACE

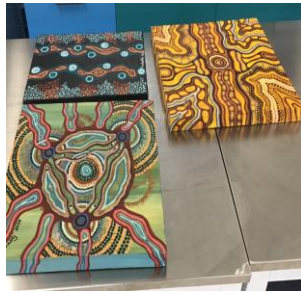
A necklace went missing from the K/PP area on Tuesday 10th November. Please contact the school if you have any information.

ALKIMOS COMMUNITY ART HOARDING PROJECT



Alkimos Beach Primary School students and staff recently participated in an art project with the Djinda Bridiya Wellbeing Australian Aboriginal Corporation on Thursday, November 12th. The visitors included the founder of the organisation, Sharon Wood-Kenney, her daughter Paige, Elder Doreen Green and Kaide Wheelock.

The visitors led a session on Aboriginal culture whereby they shared culturally and significant stories and dances with the year 4 students as well as performing a smoking ceremony. This led to an art workshop with the year 4 students. The art pieces created by the students captured elements of the six Nyoongar seasons and will be collated with other art from schools in the Alkimos Community.



The combined art will eventually be installed as part of the Metro Net artwork on the eastern side of Marmion Avenue, north of the future Romeo Road connection for the community to view and appreciate.
