

Up in Lights


Roebuck Bay 2

Kindy C and F have been busy learning all about our community!

We have been exploring how communities are built and what construction vehicles are needed to clear the land and build the different places we require in a community. We brainstormed what places a community need to have, such as shops, houses, schools, parks, hospital, fire and police station and schools. We looked at Google Maps to identify these places from a bird's eye view.

We have also been learning about the important jobs in our community and what equipment they need. We have role played excavating with diggers and trucks, made our own community maps, and created a class community with buildings and roads.

We have introduced essential Emergency Services and discovered what to do if there is an emergency. We discussed different scenarios to distinguish what is an emergency and what is not. We had Constable care come out to visit us to support our learning of calling 000 if we need help. The children have enjoyed role playing calling 000 in our class community when there is an emergency and practising what information they need to provide to the phone operator.

It has been wonderful seeing the engagement levels of all the students in our activities. They have been eagerly sharing their stories of exploring their suburbs around Alkimos and the construction work they have seen, that is taking place now.

Constable Care Incursion

Last week, Years K-6 were fortunate to view various performances during our Constable Care incursion run by the Constable Care Foundation in partnership with the WA Police Force, WA Government and the Department of Education.

The Kindergarten students watched a performance called First Aid Heroes. The puppet show taught the children how to identify a medical emergency and what they can do to help. They were introduced to DRSABC and how to call an ambulance.

The Pre-Primary to Year 2 students participated in the puppet show 'Making the right call'. This performance demonstrated how to identify an emergency, the right phone numbers to use in a range of situations, and how children can play an active role in keeping their friends, family and community safe.

The Year 3 to Year 6 students participated in an interactive performance that introduced Jasper, a new kid in school, who is having a hard time fitting in. The show demonstrated pro-social skills that can support children in creating and promoting a culture of respect and consideration amongst their school community. It encouraged the students to think about how their behaviour can affect other people.

It was wonderful to see the level of engagement from all year levels during the incursion.



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Getting Results

It's natural to want your child to do well at school and some parents use a reward such as money to encourage their children to get better grades. I've often heard of parents offering their child money for every "A" on their end of term report card.

One of the problems with giving children financial incentives for good end-of-term grades is that the reward comes too long after the effort is made.

Rather than waiting till the end of term, it's much more effective to set up a system of rewards which are brief and frequent and which encourage positive daily habits. These daily habits then build towards an eventual outcome, such as a good homework and study routine.

However, you can encourage children to build good study and homework habits without having to resort to offering money.

Why not try a reward such as spending time with your child doing an activity they really like? Or you could offer a special treat you know they'll enjoy. The object is to encourage good routines by giving extra attention and praise or small frequent rewards when they are doing the right thing.


When kids are struggling that little bit of extra attention can encourage them into new patterns of behaviour – and they may end up getting that A after all!
