A message from our Principal

Dear Parents & Carers,

With the State Government relaxing restrictions, things have returned to a much more normal approach and it has been great to see so many faces again, I think we were all starting to forget what we looked like! The following apply:

- Students, parents and staff are no longer required to wear masks on the school site. Anyone that still wishes to wear a mask, may do so.
- Parents may enter classrooms if they wish, when dropping off their child.
- We will be returning to our normal format for assemblies and our first assembly for this term will be held in Week 5 27th May and will be led by two of our Year 1 classes.

If your child develops COVID -19, please let the office know. Students who are now identified as a Household contact e.g. another family member has tested positive are able to come to school provided that they do not have any symptoms and have tested negative on a RAT each day. We do have a number of RAT tests available for parents to use on your children. If you require RAT tests please call into the office and the office staff will provide you with some. If you are unsure, please call the school before sending your child.

We are now getting into the cold and flu season. If your child is away from school, please notify the school either via Connect, a text message or by email so that we can mark your child's absence appropriately.

Walk to School Day is being held again this year on the 20th May. Information about this is being sent out on Connect with a map. This was well represented last year and Mr Allbury, Mr De Wit and Mr Innes will be walking with the students from our designated start point at the corner of Sanderling Street and Polar Way.

This week sees the start of NAPLAN for our Year 3 and Year 5 students with Writing being the first assessment for students tomorrow. Please make sure that your child gets a good night sleep and has breakfast before coming to school.

Sensei has been working with the Admin team in the design and build needs for a Japanese garden. This will be a really exciting venture and something that our students will be contributing to. Sensei has been busy with students painting rocks with Hiragana symbols for their names which will form part of the design. In MI3 and MI4 this term, the Year 4s are using Talk4Writing to learn how to create an information report. Our topic is Amazing Aliens.

We grouped all those pieces of information into the headings of diet, appearance, behaviour, habitat and fascinating facts.

Premier's Reading Challenge

Premier Mark McGowan and Education Minister Sue Ellery have today launched the Premier's Reading Challenge, encouraging young Western Australians to get reading.

The challenge will run from Thursday May 5 to Friday September 9, 2022 and is open to all students from Kindergarten to Year 10. This year's theme is 'Reading can take you anywhere', showcasing to students that a love of reading can open the door to a world of opportunities. Books can be read across all formats, including audiobooks, Braille and books in any language, and in all genres, including comics and graphic novels.

Students participating in the challenge must read at least 12 books over the five-month period to be in the running to win major prizes. Prizes include a family holiday for the winner in each of the four year group categories, and are available for students who read the most books, as well as those who have shown a significant improvement in their reading habits. Weekly prizes are also on offer. Students can go in the draw by logging a book per week.
