PEAC testing for our Year 4 students took place on Tuesday and our Year 4 students really had a good go at completing the assessments. We will get the results for these back in Term 4. Parents of students who meet the criteria, will be contacted with opportunities for extension and challenge being available for these students in 2023.

Our hard-working P&C have organised a readathon to coincide with Book Week and will be selling second-hand books from 8.00am to 8.30am and then again in the afternoon from 2.30pm to 3.00pm in the staffroom on Monday the 8th and Wednesday 10th August. The books are priced from \$1 to \$3 and there are a range of titles with books for all ages of students. Readathon sheet will be sent home initially with the students and if you require more sheets, they are available from the front office. The Readathon will run from the 8-8-2022 until the 21-8-2022 and students will need to return their sheets on the 22-8-2022. UP IN LIGHTS

Shark Bay 2

In Shark Bay Two, we are studying persuasive texts. We are learning about modality words, transition words and how to persuade an audience with well thought out reasons and rhetorical questions. The class is reading the text 'Hey Little Ant' and we have an ant farm we're also observing and writing about.

In Mathematics, we are learning about multiplication. The students are putting multiplication problems into arrays, equal groups, repeated addition and as word problems.

In Geography, we are investigating the world and learning about the different continents and oceans. In Science the students are studying chemical science and mixing lots of different materials together to observe the changes. It is going to be a fun but busy term!













Japanese & Music Incursion: Toshi & Noriko "Wasbi"

What an amazing experience the Japanese Music Incursion on Wednesday was. Toshi and Noriko have travelled from Melbourne & Adelaide to perform several songs using taiko drums and shamisen (a banjo-like instrument which has been used in Japan for more than 500 years). They talked about various aspects of these instruments and their histories.

Our students could use the Japanese words to greet our guests as well as for counting and saying "big" and "small". Hugo G & Sam K from Year 6 were also taught how to play the shamisen (Japanese banjo) and accompanied Noriko during the traditional song about cherry blossoms. Several students from each year level were randomly chosen to perform with the professionals, playing on the taiko or using chappa (cymbals), kane (hand gong) and hyoushigi (wooden clappers). The audience used their knees to join in the drumming. Even the staff were involved with their own performance. 

Premier's Reading Challenge

Premier Mark McGowan and Education Minister Sue Ellery have launched the Premier's Reading Challenge, encouraging young Western Australians to get reading.

The challenge will run from Thursday May 5 to Friday September 9, 2022 and is open to all students from Kindergarten to Year 10. This year's theme is 'Reading can take you anywhere', showcasing to students that a love of reading can open the door to a world of opportunities. Books can be read across all formats, including audiobooks, Braille and books in any language, and in all genres, including comics and graphic novels.

Students participating in the challenge must read at least 12 books over the five-month period to be in the running to win major prizes. Prizes include a family holiday for the winner in each of the four year group categories, and are available for students who read the most books, as well as those who have shown a significant improvement in their reading habits. Weekly prizes are also on offer. Students can go in the draw by logging a book per week.


