RB1 Up in Lights

This term students in RB1 have been learning about dinosaurs and are enjoying learning about these amazing prehistoric animals.

They have been learning poems and narratives during Talk 4 Writing lessons to promote early connections between oral language and written language. (Ask them to perform for you!) Students have done some sensational work on boxing up the story 'The Little Green Dinosaur' into characters, setting, beginning, middle and end. They will use their knowledge of the story to then attempt their own written narrative by innovating one aspect of the story. Students have been learning new digraphs during phonics lessons to assist in reading and writing. In Maths students have been investigating division (sharing) and multiplication (grouping) in Numeracy lessons, as well as capacity in Measurement lessons.

It has been exciting to be the first students in the school to use the new 3D printers. Students first had to learn to use the program TinkerCad. They then had to select a dinosaur to import and make adaptions to help the dinosaur in some way e.g. horns for protection, wings to move around and catch their prey / reach their food up high. Following this the students merged all objects together in preparation for the 3D printer to begin printing. When the printer finished creating their designs a little time is needed to remove the support structures before the models are complete. The boys and girls in RB1 are also focusing on being independent learners in preparation for Year One.


















Up In Lights RB2

This term in RB2 we have been learning about dinosaurs and even had a dinosaur drop off its egg! We named him Nathan the Ankylosaurus, and we have been caring for him for the last few weeks. We have been learning a Talk 4 Writing story called 'The Little Green Dinosaur' who lost his mum and then found her at the end of the text. We are hoping that it will help Nathan back to his mum! The story is teaching us a lot of new vocabulary such as timidly, hopefully and miserably, and how we can act out these feelings through our facial expressions and body language.

In maths we have been exploring capacity in lots of fun ways! We have been seeing which containers hold more or less using materials such as water, sand and rice. It has been interesting to see that it is not always the container that we predict! The first couple of weeks back to school we were learning about collecting and representing data. Check out our awesome dinosaur graphs!

Miss Schuller's Year 5 students have been engaging in regular STEM challenges. This particular one was a marshmallow catapult, who can fling their marshmallow the furthest. WEST OZ WILDLIFE INCURSION

Last week, the Kindergarten and Year 5 students (KINDY A, B, C, D, MI1 and MI2) were visited by a variety of Australian animals such as Juda the koala, Yappa the dingo, Ginger the python and Larry the blue tongue lizard.

The students enjoyed an up-close and interactive display that consolidated their learning about our native wildlife, their habitats and our role to support looking after them in the wild. The handlers from West Oz also provided educational talks on snake safety, if we ever were to spot one out and about in the warmer months. The Year 5 students showed off their newfound knowledge of animal adaptations that are integral for the animal's survival.

For some students (and teachers), this was their first real-life experience with these Australian animals. It was wonderful to see how respectful and engaged they all were during the incursion as well as their resilience and bravery to step outside their comfort zones when touching or even holding the animals.

Occupational Therapy Clinic for Children

Maximising School Participation and Performance



Are you worried about your child's school performance?

Does your child have any of the following difficulties?

- · Poor drawing, colouring and/or cutting skills
- Messy or slow handwriting
- Delayed motor skills

- Doesn't enjoy kindy/school
- Can't keep up with work in class
- Teacher has concerns with child's learning or development

OT @ ECU may be able to help your child

At the beginning of each school year, Occupational Therapy at ECU run groups at the ECU Clinic Space, Level 2, ECU Health Centre in Wanneroo. These student run groups are currently <u>free of charge</u> and aim to improve school participation and performance for children who are in the early years of primary school.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Your child will be offered a screening assessment in late January 2023. This assessment will be conducted by experienced paediatric occupational therapists and lecturers. If required, your child will be offered intervention in a group setting during term 1 or term 2, 2022.

The clinic usually offers the following groups:

- Ready, Steady, School is a school readiness group for <u>kindy and pre-primary</u> students.
 Typically these groups run once a week on Mondays from 9:30-10:30am.
- Ready, Steady, Succeed is a group that aims to develop essential school skills for children in years 1, 2 and 3. Typically these groups run on Mondays five weeks from 2:30-3:30pm.

Each group runs for 1 hour per week for 5 weeks.

HELPING ECU STUDENTS TO LEARN

Second-year ECU occupational therapy students work in the clinic with experienced clinicians. Participation in this program not only benefits you and your child, but also contributes to the education and experience of future Occupational Therapists.

IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE FOR THIS SERVICE?

Your child is eligible if they are attending primary school in Western Australia in 2022 and are NOT registered or eligible to be registered with the NDIS.

HOW CAN I REGISTER MY CHILD?

WHAT IS THE NEXT STEP?

Once you have sent your expression of interest to clinic staff, you will receive an e-mail receipt. You will be contacted for further information and, if eligible, your child may be offered an Occupational Therapy screening assessment in January (prior to commencing the group program).

Please note: places are limited and therefore <u>not all</u> <u>children</u> will be accepted into the group program.

Parents will be contacted in the order that they apply and therefore, you should register your interest today.
